



# Auction 101

**How does the auction work?**

A few days before the auction, you will receive the auction catalog. Spend some time looking through the catalog and mark your favorite items. When you arrive the night of the auction, you will receive a bid number and other important information at check-in. Enjoy cocktails and hors d'oeuvres as you bid on items in the silent auction. Join in on the excitement during the live auction while enjoying dinner, dessert, and coffee. Stop by check-out at the conclusion of the evening to settle your account by cash, check, or charge and pick up your items.

**How do I bid in the silent auction?** All items in the silent auction have a bid sheet with pre-printed bid amounts. To place your bid, simply write your bid number next to the desired bid amount.

**What if there is an item I really want, but it's too expensive for my budget?** There's strength in numbers. Try bidding on an item with a group of friends. You'll get more bang for your buck and you'll have friends to share in the fun.
