JOB TITLE: Lower School Guest Teacher

OES seeks skilled and caring educators to be guest teachers in its Lower School (PK – 5). The guest teacher works under the direction of the assistant heads of Lower School to teach in the absence of classroom teachers or specialists (music, art, Spanish, Chaplain, or physical education). The School places a high value on the cultivation of an inclusive community, social responsibility, spiritual growth, and appreciation and respect for individual differences. In addition to the qualifications detailed below, the successful guest teacher will be culturally competent and able to create a safe, nurturing environment for children in the absence of the regular classroom teacher.

This is an on-call position that comes with all state mandated benefits including paid sick leave.

## **ESSENTIAL DUTIES:**

- Report to work as soon as possible after receiving request for guest teacher.
- Carry out lessons, regular routines, and supervision duties according to the classroom or specialist teacher's plans.
- Provide a written report at the end of the day to communicate with the teacher about the day's events.

## MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS:

- BA or equivalent in education or related field
- Experience teaching elementary school aged children
- Intercultural competency, ability to engage appropriately with a diverse community and to teach diverse groups of students effectively, demonstrated commitment to equity and inclusion
- Digital literacy; intermediate MS Office suite, Google Docs/Drive and other web based applications, video conferencing and other applications as appropriate to job duties, ability to adapt as digital tools evolve and change
- Ability to pass criminal background check and drug screen

## PREFERRED QUALIFICATIONS:

- MA or equivalent in education or related field
- Five years of teaching experience

- A passion for teaching, ability to maintain a warm, productive classroom environment
- Interpersonal skills, ability to maintain collegial relations with students, parents, and colleagues

## **PHYSICAL REQUIREMENTS:**

- Primarily classroom environment; ability to communicate clearly with students, parents, and groups of individuals
- Ability to move about the classroom/school and the OES campus
- Mobility sufficient to ensure the safety of young children
- Ability to lift up to 20 pounds on an occasional basis
