The program assistant will be responsible for assisting the Extension administration and faculty with program support needs for PreK through 8th grade students in its afterschool and summer programs. The assistant will learn each position across the department and substitute as needed, as well as provide organizational support to the Extension admin team. This position will work with the Extension team to maintain program quality and standards in accordance with department guidelines, OES policies, and Oregon Office of Child Care regulations. The successful candidate will have a passion for working with school aged-children, will be excited to learn from teachers and administrators, and will demonstrate a collaborative, inclusive spirit.

This is a year-round, part-time, hourly position that comes with paid time off, 80% employer paid insurance for the employee, and a 403(b) retirement plan with generous employer match. The schedule is: M – F, 20 hours a week, usually 1:00 -5:00 pm with end time flexible depending on program needs; potential for additional hours during designated non-school days; potential for full-time summer 2019.

#### **ESSENTIAL DUTIES:**

- Substitute as needed throughout the department, as assigned by program directors, assistant directors and faculty.
- Support classroom teachers and assistant directors in program planning, preparation, instruction supervision, and documentation of student learning.
- Support Extension administration in managing daily program operations, including daily clerical projects.
- Work with students grades PreK-8th in various settings- large group, small group, and individually.
- Follow Extension daily roles and responsibilities as assigned.
- Provide careful and concentrated supervision of gathering and play areas to ensure students' safety.
- Implement student support protocols (behavior and safety) that set and maintain appropriate standards for children's behavior using non-punitive methods that promote development of problem solving skills and support self-esteem.
- Provide a caring environment with respect for students' individual differences.
- Maintain and clean all shared supplies, equipment, and facilities.
- Attend orientation, staff meetings and training sessions as required, as well as, pursuing a minimum 15 hours professional development every year.
- Maintain current Child Care Division Central Background Registry, Food Handler, CPR/First Aid certifications, and professional development hours in Oregon Registry Online (ORO).
- Attend other events as requested.
