

OES Policy on Travel-related Quarantine

For the 2021-22 School Year

Updated January 14, 2022

While the Covid-19 global pandemic continues, the CDC recommends avoiding non-essential travel until fully vaccinated. As a community, OES recognizes that many people will continue to travel for a variety of reasons. We ask our community members to carefully consider the risks associated with travel as well as their actions and activities, and to make decisions that minimize their exposure to Covid-19. Recognizing that some means of travel pose more risks than others, we have established the following expectations for post-travel quarantine with guidance from the Oregon Health Authority:

- Any student or community member who is fully vaccinated (2 or more weeks past the final shot and, if eligible, has received a booster) does not need to quarantine post-travel.
- If a student who is not fully vaccinated* against Covid-19 travels by car with household or pod members, either within or outside of Oregon, and adheres to all standard safety protocols, OES will not require a post-travel quarantine.
- If a student who is not fully vaccinated* against Covid-19 travels by public conveyance (plane, bus, cruise, boat, or train, not including local Portland-area transportation) they must quarantine at home before returning to campus. Quarantine at home for 5 days and take a test for Covid-19 to return to school. If their test result is negative, and they have not experienced any symptoms during the quarantine period and have not been exposed to anyone with Covid-19 in the previous two weeks, they may submit their test result to the division office and return to school after completing the 5 day quarantine.

*A person is considered fully vaccinated against Covid-19 two weeks after their final shot and, if eligible, has received a booster. OES community members who are fully vaccinated do not need to quarantine post travel.
