The successful assistant teacher will have a passion for working with elementary and middle school aged students, will be excited to learn from teachers and administrators, and will demonstrate strong interpersonal skills, and an upbeat, collaborative, inclusive spirit.

Schedule: M - F, 2:30 - 6:00 P.M. (end time may be flexible); 8 hours during designated non-school days; potential for full-time summer 2019. This is a part-time, hourly, academic year position that comes with paid holidays and sick leave.

- Support classroom teacher in planning, preparation, instruction supervision, and documentation of student learning.
- Work with students in various settings large group, small group and individually.

- Attend orientation, staff meetings, and training sessions as required.
- Pursue a minimum 15 hours' professional development every year.
