JOB TITLE: Summer STEM Teacher

OES seeks an enthusiastic, conscientious educator to teach science, technology, engineering and mathematics (STEM) in its summer program. The summer STEM teacher designs and implements STEM camps for PreK through 12th grade students following OES standards and methods for instruction. The STEM teacher promotes and models curiosity and the exploration of ideas and concepts while fostering an appreciation for lifelong learning. In addition to the qualifications detailed below, the successful STEM teacher possesses excellent communication and interpersonal skills, strong organizational skills, and the ability to support the [OES mission and identity](#). SCHEDULE: 9:00 am-4:00 pm teaching time plus prep time, M-F, June 22 - August 21, teaching at least 4 out of the 8 weeks

ESSENTIAL DUTIES:

- Collaborate with Extension staff and fellow teachers to design cohesive STEM programming within summer framework.
- Develop and implement a strong, inquiry-based and differentiated curriculum which teaches a specific strand within STEM curriculum, including but not limited to technology and programming, robotics, engineering and design, film and animation, life science, etc.
- Develop intellectually challenging and creative camps with developmentally appropriate and research-based practices.
- Use a variety of best curricular and instructional approaches and methods including experiential learning, cycle of inquiry, and conceptual and manipulative-based approaches, reading, writing, etc.
- Support students and staff in developing understanding and skills in the use of technology tools for inquiry, productivity, creativity, collaboration, problem solving, communication, programming, organization and appropriate use.
- Develop a safe, nurturing, and exciting environment conducive to classes of 10-20 students.
- Develop technology inquiry opportunities to explore design, automation and engineering in the EC3 center.
- Promote the responsible, safe, and healthy use of equipment, materials, and environment.
- Individualize instruction and educate the whole child.
- Develop a familiarity with a framework for understanding students' individual strengths, affinities, and challenges.
- Work collaboratively with colleagues in a spirit of openness and cooperation.
- Demonstrate kindness, enthusiasm, and a passion for teaching.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS:

- BA/BS or equivalent in relevant discipline
- 2-5 years of culinary arts teaching experience
- Experience integrating technology into course curriculum
- Intercultural competence, ability to teach diverse groups of students effectively; ability to work well with a wide array of students, coworkers, and family members, including those from underrepresented communities
- Advanced digital literacy; some proficiency in MS Office, Google Drive and other web based applications as appropriate to job duties
- Ability to pass a background check and drug screen

PREFERRED QUALIFICATIONS:

- MA/MS or equivalent in relevant discipline
- Teaching License
- Prior work experience in a school setting, public or independent school
- Previous team teaching experience

KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS, AND ABILITIES:

- Ability to collaborate and work effectively on teams
- Interpersonal skills, ability to maintain positive relations with colleagues, students, family members
- Communication skills to interact with students, families, and colleagues

PHYSICAL REQUIREMENTS:

- Primarily classroom environment, ability to stand or sit to deliver curriculum
- Ability to sit at computer and keyboard for moderate periods
- Ability to lift up to 20 pound on an occasional basis
- Ability to communicate clearly with colleagues, parents, and the public
- Mobility sufficient to move about the campus and to assure the safety of young children
